Access to Care

The U.S. Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) are Conducting a Public Education Campaign for the No Surprises

Act, a New Federal Statute Which Bans Surprise Medical Bills



Surprise medical bills represent a financial burden for many Americans.

As of January 1, 2022, consumers have new protections against surprise bills when getting emergency care, non-emergency care from **out-ofnetwork providers** at **in-network** facilities, and air ambulance services from out-of-network providers.

Through new rules aimed at protecting consumers, excessive out-of-pocket costs are restricted, and emergency services must continue to be covered without any prior authorization, regardless of whether or not a provider or facility is in-network.

CMS has an array of educational materials for consumers and providers on thier website, **www.CMS.gov/Nosurprises**. These include videos, slide decks, and FAQs.
